

# ANC 1A Public Safety Committee Report for July 11, 2012

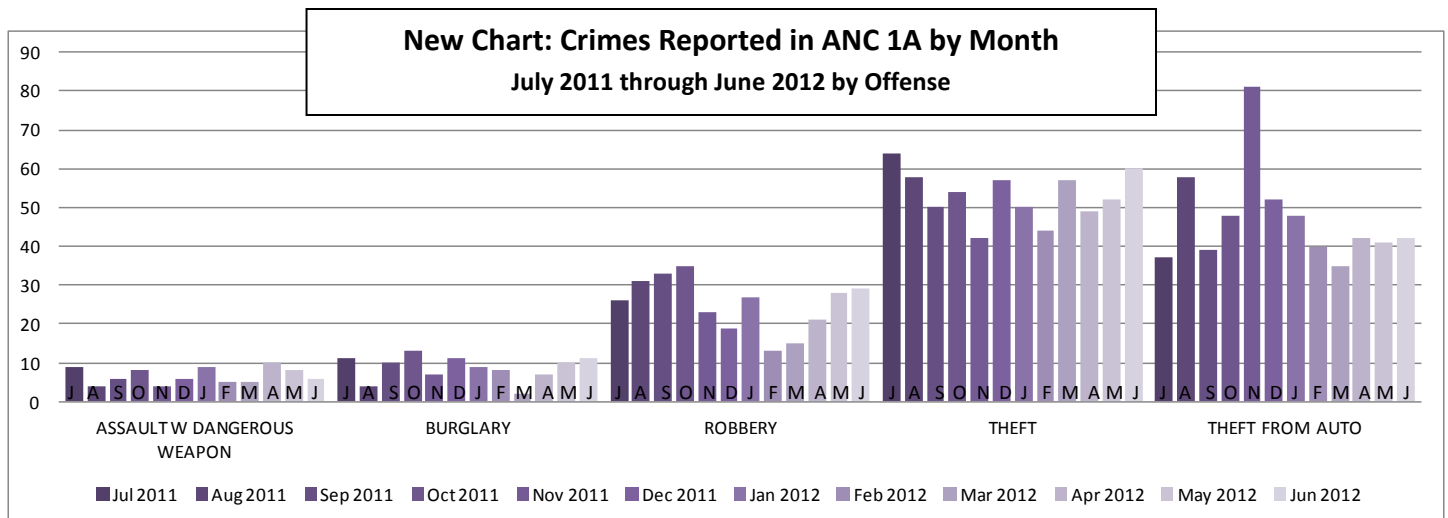

## Crime Prevention Tips: Above all, don't make yourself an easy target:

- Robberies occur at all times of day, so be aware of your surroundings at all times while walking or while on the Metro. Avoid talking on the phone while walking, or in public places. Instead, pay attention to your surroundings--criminals often target victims who appear distracted. If something or someone seems suspicious, trust your instincts, and go to a safe place if possible.
- Since many robberies happen late at night, be especially cautious if you're out past midnight. If a stranger approaches you, do not engage in conversation. Stay on well-lit main roads where there are lots of people, or take a cab.
- As much as possible, don't carry or display items attractive to thieves. Cell phones, iPods, watches, wallets and cash are reported stolen often.
- To avoid having your car broken into, never leave anything of value in plain view--use the trunk or the glove compartment. Be sure that GPS devices, laptop computers, purses, backpacks, gym bags, cell phones, cameras, iPods, coats, sunglasses, and even spare change are out of sight. If possible, put valuables in the trunk before you arrive at your final destination so that watching thieves won't see. Consider leaving often-stolen items at home when they are not needed.
- To avoid home burglaries, remember to take all the usual precautions (sturdy locks for doors and windows, alarm systems, lighting, etc.) Use extra security measures when you're on vacation.
- At the gym, secure your belongings with a sturdy lock.
- Never leave purses, wallets, cell phones or electronics unattended in public places like restaurants.

## DC Fish Carryout: MPD Bust, Felony Arrests for Crack – Can We Get to 500 Petition Signatures?



Based on strong investigative leads that crack cocaine was being sold on the premises, DC's Metropolitan Police Department conducted an investigation that led to 3 felony arrests at the DC Fish Carryout, at 14<sup>th</sup> and Otis NW. Those arrested included the store's owner, Suk "Bruce" In Hyun, 54, who holds a DC license to sell tobacco and alcoholic beverages.

Nearly 450 community members have signed a petition to support license revocation. The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board's public hearing to decide is scheduled for August 1st. If you haven't signed the petition yet, there's still time! 500 signatures would send an unequivocal message of community commitment to future change. Let's stand strong to ensure that crack cocaine will not continue to be sold at this address for the years to come.
