## SAFE PASSAGE PROGRAM – **\*\*Columbia Heights added this school year\*\***

In Safe Passage Priority Areas, regular calls or meetings are held between school leaders, MPD, Department of Transportation (DDOT), and Metro Transit Police to discuss student safety concerns, plan assistance that is provided to areas, and share strategies for improving safety. Feedback from each meeting is used to determine what additional supports are needed. When needed, government agencies participate in citywide safe passage campaigns by adopting an area and providing physical support during student arrival and dismissal.
