## **Rationale:**

The changes above reflect consultation with the Committee on Transportation, Parks, and Public Spaces chairperson, with whom the Special Committee currently shares limited coordination over specific public space and park issues and other Members. The Transportation Committee reiterated the committee's focus on parks and recreation, expressing a desire to work in greater coordination on related efforts that implicate public life and other community planning efforts. The Special Committee's current mandate has been to examine and study public life in Columbia Heights, including activities in public spaces like our neighborhood parks and plazas and across the public realm writ large. Making the changes above clarifies the scope of the Special Committee's existing role while ensuring the Committee on Transportation, Parks, and Public Spaces continues to partner in efforts to understand how improvements to public space can influence and impact public life and overall quality of life in Columbia Heights.
